**Meeting of February 2, 2015**

**Larry Wyckoff opened the meeting at 6:30**

**Dana Sweet made the motion to accept the minutes of January 26, David Vaughan seconded,  
so voted.**

**Larry Wyckoff went through the budget line by line. Under new construction he said that the  
extra \$200,000 was to open Bartlett Hill Road all the way through. Dana Sweet said that the  
cost would be \$400,000 plus. There are some people on the hill who do not want the road  
open. Three other options are: raising Pumpkin Harbor Road (\$350,000 plus); going  
through Bill and Candy Morey's property or going over Urie Road. Dana said that the people  
need a way out during floods in case of an emergency. David Vaughan said that the Board is  
looking at all of the options Bonnie Waninger head of LCPC said that it would take three to  
five years to get FEMA money for the project**

**Larry Wyckoff said the David Vaughan wanted to go to 72 hours per month for State Police coverage. Sgt. Julie Cooper said they could do it.**

**The Finance Committee and Select Board left the Rescue appropriation at \$80,000.**

**David Blittersdorf from All Earth Renewables was in to talk about solar panels. Larry said that Dana wants a solar park in the gravel pit. Larry said we have two sites. The gravel pit and at the transfer station area. David said that 30% federal tax does not work if you are a municipality. He said the town could host the park. His company will get it permitted and sell the power to Smugglers Notch Management Co. David's company could put it in, finance the project and give the town a lease. He also said that the town could not cross utility boundaries . The town could realize \$7,200 or \$14,000 depending on the size. David Vaughan said the Board would like a proposal from All Earth Renewables.**

**The Select Board signed liquor licenses. The Select Board voted to do arbitrage with the Union Bank - 1.39% to borrow and 1.84% on the investment side.**

**David Vaughan made the motion to adjourn at 8:20 p.m., Dana Sweet seconded - so voted.**
