6:00 p.m. There were two requests for abatement of taxes. Jane Porter read the oath to the BCA. She read the letters from the two people making requests.

The first request after discussion Cora Conly made the motion to not abate taxes. Muriel McCuin seconded; so voted.

The Board of Civil Authority approved the checklist with the new additions and deletions.

Luke Shullenberger from Green Lantern Group was in about solar projects. The focus of his company is on municipalities and non-profits. 500Kw is on 3.5 acres.

Their company develops, finances and does the permitting for the project and gets the tax credits. Non-profit investors cannot get tax credits. Their company has more than 20 projects. One example is the Laraway School in Johnson.

Luke said that the meeting tonight is a courtesy meeting in case the town has any concerns about the project on Westman Road.

Any owner of the project can do a buyout at their end of year six. The panels are usually good for 25 years and the racks and lines are good for 50 years. These projects are taxable. This project is fixed-ground mounts no trackers.

Dana and David asked them to present a proposal for the installation of solar at the site on Route 104 near the town disposal area.

Dana Sweet made the motion to approve the minutes of February 2nd. David Vaughan seconded, so voted.
