Rich Williams was not contacted and did not attend the meeting.

Dick Goff discussed a Class 4 roads letter and asked the select board to indicate that Class 4 maintenance is at the decision of Select Board. The period for action on Ancient Roads action has expired and reverts back to property owners.

Larry addressed the Rutland Town Resolution letter from Laura Perzall Re: siting issues with large solar farms. The board chose not to address the resolution last year. 115 towns have signed on and the letter was again reviewed. Larry will forward a copy to the town clerk. Motion to sign, Seconded, Approved

Jean J reported on Stormwater Grant project at CES. This is a reimbursable grant and Town will have to front funds with quarterly reimbursement. Jean also asked for some support from Town Garage on backhoe use. She will forward the documents for this grant to keep good communication with all parties. She reported on the education component as part of the seven phases of the project.

Jean also reported on the FEMA grant for her home elevation, which was signed 19 months after her application. The town will have to advance the expense on this project since the town was the applicant on her behalf. The town will be contacted to discuss financial information. Jean has stepped down from her Jeffersonville representation in LCPC to avoid conflict of interest. She will have to make living arrangements during the project.

Karen Obert addressed the landscaping of the roundabout center on Rte. 15. The state makes no consideration for landscaping maintenance. Continued volunteer effort is not sustainable and she proposed utilizing a landscaping service at town expense. Larry cited safety issues and the town garage will post warning signs as necessary. Motion to approve \$850 labor for seasonal landscaping, Seconded, Approved

A resolution to fund an architectural study of improvements at the Rescue Squad building was approved at town meeting, and a meeting will be setup with Steve Trala to start the process.

There was a discussion of a circulated petition to place speed tables at areas of poor speed compliance. Radar lights as an alternate were discussed. No action taken.

The State Police lease contract was discussed and an auto liability policy requirement will have to be removed. Options were discussed for housekeeping at the lessee's expense.

Brian Albarelli and Doug Babcock questioned the decision of the selectboard to replace Brian on the LCPC as a Cambridge representative. The board explained their prerogative and the reasons for the decision.
